"PaDEP notified me 8/9/21 that coating repairs had to be completed (on containment coating) by 8/20/21 or the station would receive a follow-up inspection from PaDEP, along with a potential Notice of Violation for coating deficiencies. I reached out to Maintenance for help... the biggest challenge was the timely procurement of the necessary Carboline coating ... paint and specialty coating products extremely hard to find. Merrick worked all of their contacts and found some Part A in Green Bay, Wisconsin, and some Part B in Houston, Texas. The Green Bay delivery came in on time, but the Houston delivery never materialized... Merrick contacted the supplier and got contact info for a company in New York that had recently purchased some cans of the Part B and was able to buy the necessary amount of Part B off of them. Merrick sent one of their own people to New York to pick-up the Part B! In short, Merrick went above and beyond... to ensure the timely completion of the coating repair work, helping the station avoid a Notice of Violation. Additionally, Merrick's skilled NACE-certified coating applicators completed the coating repairs correctly the first time -- all under the direct scrutiny of a PaDEP-certified Tank Inspector. PaDEP accepted the Maintenance Mod Report and now considers the matter closed. So, again...I just wanted to pass along Chemistry's sincere appreciation for the prioritization and support provided by the SLT and Maintenance to address this coating repair issue, and for the outstanding execution of the repair plan by Maintenance and Merrick."



The CoreStar IM-2 Manipulator system is used to position the eddy current probe for heat exchanger or condenser inspections. The IM-2 system is often used in situations where environmental or radiological conditions prevent inspection using a human probe handler. The use of a manipulator to perform these inspections reduces the time personnel must spend in an area from hours to minutes, reducing the impact of the hazards. The IM-2 system can also be used in "clean" environments to provide benefits in overall productivity and positioning accuracy. Personnel using the IM-2 require training in installation, set-up, and operation; additional training on system troubleshooting and system maintenance is also provided. The Denver office has a mock condenser wall set up for training purposes. This season we will be utilizing the robot at McGuire, VC Summer & Oconee. Thanks to everyone who is learning the new wave in acquisition!!

HALLUCINOGENS <u>Types</u> LSD, PCP, mescaline, psilocybin <u>Physical Signs</u> Capsules, microdots, blotter squares <u>Behavioral Signs</u> : Blank stare, rapid eye movement, poor coordination, flashbacks	MENTAL STRESS Signs Increased irritability, depression, fatigue, overreacting, impulsiveness, constant worry <u>Causes</u> Family, finances, work Can become chronic over a long period of time	ILLNESS Symptoms Headaches, nausea, body aches, fever, congestion Being sick on the job and/or taking medication for your sickness could contribute to your fitness for duty	FATIGUE Symptoms Lack of energy, drowsiness Signs Sleepiness, red eyes, irritability, memory loss, low energy <u>Preventative</u> <u>Measures</u> Good sleep pattern, proper consumption of food & alcohol
