




WALK LIKE A PENGUIN

- Engage in Safe Walking: From the time you step out of your vehicle to go to work, to the time you get back in your vehicle to go home.
- Mindset: Imagine how carefully you would walk if you were carrying a baby in your arms in icy conditions use that level of caution when walking on ice and snow.







Remember:

- Check your Footwear! Unsafe winter footwear includes: sandals, crocs, open-toed, open-heeled & sling back shoes, high heels, worn soles, and low-traction dress shoes.
- Keep hands free: for balance and to help mitigate falls
- Use floor mats when entering a building to stomp the snow and ice off your shoes
- Wear gloves instead of keeping hands in pockets
- Use a backpack to carry items, so you are hands are free.

What happens if you have done all the safety tips and still feel yourself start to fall? Try to tuck your chin so that your back, not your head will hit the ground first. Also, try to twist or roll on your side to help spread the impact of the fall and not just have the impact of the force of your fall on one body area increasing the chances for injury.

- Bruce Power became the world's largest operating nuclear facility in 2012, when Units 1 & 2 returned to operation after a multibillion-dollar refurbishment project.
- This project returned the site to full operating capacity for the first time in 17 years.
